Megan mentioned that there wasn't many volunteers for this stay after.

Megan said that at the Open House, there were many parents that said that they would help at both, but since the grades were split for the stay after, they would only do the one. There were multiple parents who said they couldn't help at either one, because they have multiple kids in the school, and the stay afters aren't for everyone like they used to be.

Megan mentioned that even students complained that they were split. There were siblings upset that the stay after was split.

It was brought up multiple times last school year, that students were upset they only had 2 stay afters, instead of the 3 that they had in prior years. This year, the students seemed even more upset because they only get 1. Megan brought this concern up multiple times, but had no response from it. Other people seemed to disagree. Some stated that safety was the main concern, and they couldn't have safety with all the grades being there (even though it was before).

However, Megan brought up the fact that after the 7 and 8 grade stay after, they would be walking across two parking lots (middle school and high school) to the back to school bash, while cars are picking up students (who weren't staying for the back to school bash, or finishing football practice) or dropping off their child(ren) for the back to school bash. She asked "how is that safe? Where are all the safety concerns for this?" There was no response.

Megan said that she would not be volunteering at either of the Stay Afters this year. The reason for this is because she has children in multiple grades, and only one is allowed at each one. Her children did not think this split is fair and do not want to be at the one that they are not "invited to" and is not for them. So she is standing up for her kids and being a Mom first. That upsets and bothers one of the officers. Megan apologized that it bothers her, but she is putting her kids first. Each of her kids are attending the stay after that they are invited to and that is for them, without their mom and sibling.
