<p>Writer's Workshop Writers understand that a writer can learn to write a variety of poems from studying mentor texts so that they have an example to refer back to when writing their own poems.</p> <p>Writing Have-to: Your task is to compose a poem using all of the words from one of the lists. Try to write another poem using another list.</p>	<p>Writer's Workshop Writers of poetry understand the importance of specific word choice in poetry so that they create a poem which is interesting to the reader.</p> <p>Writing Have-to: In your poems from yesterday, look for ways to improve the word choice. Can you use more descriptive words to paint a picture in the mind of your reader?</p>	<p>Writer's Workshop Writers of poetry use poetic devices such as imagery, similes, and metaphors in their poetry so that it appeals to the reader's senses.</p> <p>Writing Have-to: Go back to the poems you wrote yesterday, and look for places you can add imagery, alliteration, or similes into your poems.</p>	<p>Writer's Workshop Writers of poetry understand the beat or rhythm of a poem and its relation to the line breaks so that the beat of the poem is correct.</p> <p>Writing Have-to: If you have rhyming in your poem, can you adjust the lines so that they have an equal/even beat or a repeating rhythm to them?</p>	<p>Writer's Workshop: Writers understand the way print works in poems and demonstrate the use in reading and writing them by using white spaces and line breaks to make their poems look appealing.</p> <p>Writing Have-to: Choose your favorite poem, proofread it, edit it, and type it. Add a picture to make it ready for print.</p>
